## **Saturday Programs**

### **Lodge Leadership Skills 101**

The art of leadership and associated essential skills such as delegation, motivation and planning will be discussed.

### **Grand Lodge Operations and Finance**

Participants will be introduced to the services and support Lodges can expect from the Grand Lodge Office and how to access required resources and information. An overview of our budget and finances will also be provided.

### **Communication & Conflict Resolution**

A workshop on how to have effective conversations with Lodge members on difficult issues and deal with conflict situations.

### **Running Effective Meetings**

The A,B,C's of running effective meetings including planning and preparation, establishing the agenda, conducting the meeting, action planning and follow-up.

### **Building a Parthenon (Lodge Planning)**

This presentation will deal with the fundamental how's and why's of developing a plan for your Lodge.

### **Lodge Officers' Roles and Responsibilities**

Although there are differences from Lodge to Lodge, there are many shared expectations with respect to Lodge officers' roles and responsibilities. These expectations will be explored by participants of this interactive workshop.

### **Membership (Attract, Retain, Coach and Mentor)**

This presentation will consider a successful “6-Step Program” which has assisted one Lodge in successfully attracting, retaining and developing the “right” men.

### **Lodge Assessment (Lodge Excellence Program)**

What should a Lodge be doing to be successful and to improve? Participants in this session will consider this question and learn about the “Lodge Excellence Program” which can be used to conduct an assessment of their Lodge and assist the Lodge in developing plans for strategic development and improvement.

### **From Whence Do We Come? (Origins of the four rituals practiced in our jurisdiction)**

An educational program that will trace the origins, similarities and differences of the four rituals practiced in our jurisdiction.

### **Options (Alternative Lodge Forms & Structures)**

Participants will be introduced to different Lodge concepts that can be adopted or adapted to suit the needs of individual Lodges seeking new and innovative ways of attracting and retaining membership.
