



Trevor W. McKeown

Retired communications administrator Trevor W. McKeown has been an active Freemason for almost forty years. He edited the Grand Lodge *Masonic Bulletin* for its final fifteen years, and his work in creating and maintaining the website, freemasonry.bcy.ca for almost a quarter century has been internationally recognized.

Frequently serving as chairman of the Vancouver Grand Masonic Day Committee, he has also coördinated lecture tours on Freemasonry and masoniphobia. During his years with the Community Relations Committee he edited and designed a 28-page media booklet, and was photo editor and scriptwriter for two promotional videos. He has travelled across British Columbia, Washington and Oregon, lecturing on the history of Freemasonry.

Inaugural speaker to the Canadian Academy of Independent Scholars, he was also the Philalethes Luncheon Speaker at the 2015 Conference of Grand Masters of North America. His work has been published in *The Traveller Magazine* (2007), *Martial Arts of the World, An Encyclopedia of History and Innovation* (2010) and *Ars Quatuor Coronatorum* (2009, &c.). His onscreen appearances have been limited to brief appearances in *Riddles in Stone* (2007) and *The Hidden Faith of the Founding Fathers* (2010), and the occasional interview for CBC TV.

As curator of the Vancouver Masonic Library and Museum, a position he has held since 1996, he has created a comprehensive cataloguing system and programme for the display and preservation of our collections, a system that has been adopted by a number of masonic libraries across Canada. He is also currently the chairman of the Grand Lodge of British Columbia and Yukon Library and Archives Board of Trustees.
